



Pastor's Pen ...

Dear Friends in Christ,

I ran across a devotional book with the Title: <u>21 Days of Breakthrough Prayer</u>; carrying the subtitle: "The Power of Agreement." It begins by asking these questions that impact all of our lives: "Are there things in your personal life, your loved ones' lives, or your church life that need to change for the better? Are you ready to discover a breakthrough in these challenging situations? Have you ever considered that God is just waiting for His people to cry out to Him in prayer together?"

"The Prayer of Agreement" is one of the most powerful gifts that God has provided for victory in our Christian lives. Jesus Himself boldly proclaimed, "Again I say to you that if two of you agree on earth concerning anything that they ask, it will be done for them by My Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered together in my name, I am there in the midst of them." (Mt 18:19-20)

This seems to be a declaration from Jesus that there is great power in what we might call our "prayers of agreement." Now thankfully, we know that God is our loving Father, and we can always present ourselves into God's presence in prayer. By faith, God's sons and daughters are assured that we have the privilege of spending time with God in prayer, any time, any day. But we cannot deny the encouragement we have to pray with one another in agreeing prayer. For Jesus is clearly telling us that God will respond to a time of focused prayer as we seek God's face together. II Chronicles 7:14 holds a famous verse: "If my people who are called by my name will humble themselves, and pray and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land." (By the way, this was Charles Coble's favorite verse.)

But I think you and I would probably need to admit that in our busy lives, prayer seems to keep being pushed away... removed from our daily agendas too easily. Yes, we either get too busy, or we are just not convinced that prayer power is sufficient enough to change our circumstances. Busyness and "success" occupy our lives and before long, prayer is no longer a priority. And that is the danger. For when we lack fellowship with God in prayer, discouragement, anxiety, even burnout in our Christian walk is the peril.

There is a problem that we must resolve. I think it would be easy, for instance, for all of us to agree that it would be nice to win the lottery and pay off our church debt and get that off our plates. But we must always remember, that while we may agree with each other on something, even as crazy as winning the lottery (which would express our will), that we must still recognize that no matter how many persons you may have in your circle of agreement, there is still one more party to the agreement. That is God... God must agree. We must still finally pray, "thy will be done."

As we approach the season of Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday, February 26, let us avoid discouragement, anxiety, and burnout by being faithful in our fellowship with God. Let's agree to pray more. Let's agree to pray for God's Kingdom Power, that it may be breathed into the life of our church and all our people. Let's agree to seek the fulfillment of the promise of Jesus who said, "Again I say to you that if two of you agree on earth concerning anything that they ask, it will be done for them by My Father in heaven."


